Frankinsence Research & Conservation

In February 2024, a collaborative frankincense field survey was successfully completed in Dhofar, thanks to the joint efforts of the Environment Authority, Wageningen University, FairSource Botanicals LLC, and Mendel University in Brno. Employing drone technology, the team conducted numerous flights over various regions of Dhofar to map frankincense populations. The team is currently analyzing the data collected to determine tree numbers, density, and distribution. Concurrently, the Environment Society of Oman organized a capacitybuilding initiative on frankincense monitoring and research at the Environment Authority's Dhofar Office. Nineteen individuals participated in the event, which featured presentations covering topics of frankincense introduction, global threats, management strategies, inventory techniques, monitoring methods, and mapping. The workshop also facilitated engaging discussions and a Q&A session, enhancing the overall experience. Raptors Research & Conservation

We have successfully concluded the initial phase of an Egyptian Vulture breeding survey on Masirah Island. This survey, a follow-up to the 2012 assessment, reaffirmed the presence of breeding pairs on the island. Over the course of 9 days, the team meticulously inspected all territories identified in 2012. Currently, the collected data is undergoing analysis to assess changes in the number of territorial pairs, the ratio of non-breeding adults to immatures, and to estimate the breeding population. We are grateful for the funding provided by Renaissances Services SAOG to support this

The Environment Society of Oman (ESO) recently organized a 'Lighting Pollution Community Workshop' on Masirah Island, aimed to thank the local community for their efforts to safeguard sea turtles on Masirah, with particular emphasis on the loggerhead species.

Sea turtles, predominantly residing in open ocean, rely on

beaches for nesting, with females visiting at night during nesting seasons. However, artificial lights disrupt this process, disorienting females and deterring hatchlings from reaching the sea. This pollution stems from lights near nesting beaches, including those from roads and residential areas. In 2021, ESO initiated a pilot project to combat light pollution, retrofitting residential in mitigating the impact of light pollution on these turtles, and participants were thanked for joining this pilot project. Other members of the community were encouraged to voluntarily participate and install turtle-friendly light bulbs in their homes situated on turtle nesting beaches. This collaborative initiative involves partnerships with the **Environment Authority** and **Future** Seas Global SPC, funded by The US Fish & Wildlife Service. Dr. Amor Almataani, ESO's President, expressed gratitude to participants and government entities for their support, stressing


