

Raptors Research & Conservation

In June 2024, we conducted a second round of Egyptian vulture surveys on Masirah Island. The data collected is currently being analyzed to assess changes in the number of territorial pairs, the ratio of non-breeding adults to immatures, and to estimate the overall breeding population. This research is crucial for understanding and conserving the species. We extend our gratitude to **Renaissance Services SAOG** for their funding, which has been instrumental in supporting this important project.



World Environment Day

World Environment Day, celebrated annually on June 5th, raises awareness about environmental issues and inspires global action. Each year focuses on a specific theme to address pressing environmental concerns. We are proud to see many organizations in Oman share in this celebration and were delighted to be invited by some of our partners to join them.



Namat Competition

The Namat Competition's final assessment and school visits were successfully completed, covering 11 schools across 6 governorates oversix days. Schools effectively incorporated competition themes, positively

May to September. Alongside these surveys, the team has been actively rescuing sea turtles that were misoriented, flipped over, or trapped on rocks. Additionally, we have expanded our educational resources with the release of the **Nesting Sea Turtles of Oman Introductory Guide** and the **Sea** Turtles of Oman Children's Activity Booklet, complementing our recently produced Nesting Sea Turtles of Masirah infographic. Final electronic versions are available in the ESO Resources Page. We extend our gratitude to the US Fish and Marine Service for their funding, which has been instrumental in supporting this important project.

On June 4th, we had an early celebration with Alizz Islamic Bank, attending an insightful talk about air pollution and its effect on climate change, presented by Sayyida Dr Jihad Al Busaidi. Additionally, we were delighted to be part of **PDO**'s dedicated exhibition on June 25-26, where ESO showcased its efforts and environmental contributions to the PDO staff.

impacting their communities by eliminating single-use water bottles and utilizing reusable alternatives. Greywater usage improved, now connected to solar and wind energy for pumping. Previous participants, maintained sustainability and encouraged innovation and entrepreneurship. Six schools were awarded, with three receiving incentive prizes for outstanding work: Jmail bin Khamis School, Al Azher bin Muhammed Al Azkawi School, Jimah School, Al Amal Deaf School, Om Dher Al Ghafari School, and Wadi bani Omar School. International Day for Biological Diversity

International Day for Biological Diversity, celebrated on May 22, raises awareness about the vital role of biodiversity in sustaining life on Earth. It highlights the importance of preserving diverse ecosystems, species, and genetic resources, and encourages global action to protect and sustainably manage our planet's natural wealth.

ESO was invited to celebrate this day at an exhibition organized by one of our key partners, Nama Water Services, held at their headquarters. The event brought together key contributors to Oman's biodiversity, including ESO. We are thankful for Nama Water's efforts in organizing this exhibition and recognizing the significance of this day for Oman.



National Geographic Society's 2024 Wayfinder Award

ESO's Executive Director, Suaad Al Harthi, received the National Geographic Society's 2024 Wayfinder Award and has joined the global National Geographic Explorer Community. Wayfinder Award recipients are individuals who have proven themselves to be the next generation of influential leaders, communicators and innovators whose critical work inspires us to learn about, care for, and protect the wonder of our world. Suaad presented a 3-minute spotlight talk during the National Geographic Explorers Festival in Washington, DC showcasing the unique Arabian Sea humpback whales as flagships for broader conservation initiatives carried out by ESO; highlighting their isolation, low population size, threats they face and the need for conservation advocacy.



PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Ad Dimaniyyat Islands Nature Reserve Community Engagement Campaign

ESO has successfully wrapped up its 'Ad Dimaniyyat Islands Nature Reserve (DINR) Awareness Raising and Community Engagement Campaign,' a five-month initiative dedicated to highlighting the reserve's rich biodiversity and its crucial ecological role. Designated in 1996, DINR comprises nine islands 15 km offshore from the coast of Muscat towards Barka, known for their turtle nesting beaches, bird breeding grounds, stunning natural scenery, and vibrant coral reefs.

DINR is a vital nesting site for the critically endangered hawksbill turtle (*Eretmochelys imbricata*) and the vulnerable green turtle (*Chelonia mydas*). It also attracts the endangered whale shark (Rhincodon typus) between August and November. The island's cliffs and rocky areas provide ideal nesting habitats for the vulnerable sooty falcon (Falco concolor), the osprey (Pandion haliaetus), and various tern species.

Throughout the campaign, ESO focused on raising awareness about DINR's unique flora and fauna, addressing five major threats to the reserve, and advocating for ways the public can help in mitigating those threats. The campaign primarily targeted local communities in Bousher, Al Seeb, Barka, and Al Mussanah, given their coastal locations and proximity to the reserve.

ESO's efforts were extensive, reaching out to 1,387 individuals, including representatives from Wali offices, Omani Women's Associations, fishermen, government officials, and students from various schools and universities. EA rangers working at DINR were also engaged due to their critical role in managing the reserve

ESO would like to extend its appreciation firstly to Ms Dana Sarhan, Mongol Rally, and Glowing Glowing Gone for their

generous donations and funding for this project. Additionally, we are grateful to Mr Ali Al Rasbi, Community Engagement Consultant, for his dedication in leading this initiative with ESO and contributing to raising awareness about Oman's rich biodiversity among the youth and local communities.

To further raise awareness, ESO developed an infographic and a bilingual biodiversity booklet detailing the main terrestrial and marine species of DINR. Both resources are available on ESO's website. This campaign aligns with ESO's broader mission to raise the public's awareness about environmental issues and promote sustainable practices in Oman.

Through local engagement and educational initiatives, ESO aims to foster a deeper connection between communities and their natural heritage, ensuring that the unique biodiversity is protected for generations to come.










JUNE TALK
