





Oman Environment Day

Masirah Island Net Removal Campaign

As part of ESO's ongoing programme to protect sea turtle species nesting on Masirah Island, ESO is committed to clearing abandoned fishing nets and other marine debris from important turtle nesting beaches, with an estimated 765 tons of abandoned fishing gear removed since 2017! Our recent clean-up was made possible thanks to funding provided by the US Fish and Wildlife Service, Marine Turtle Conservation Fund and was delivered in collaboration with Future Seas Global SPC. We would like to thank the Environment Authority, Be'ah, Ecovision and Masirah Municipality for their support.



Raptor Field Survey

During Q1 our team undertook field surveys on Masirah Island to monitor the occurrence, breeding and potential threats to Egyptian vultures found on the island. This population was last surveyed in 2012, when 52 breeding territories were found to be occupied by pairs, one of the highest densities in the world. 11 years later we are completing the same survey to understand the population breeding The second r of the will take place in April 2023. Climate Change Awareness Videos

ESO Annual General Meeting (AGM)

ESO's AGM was held on 14th March, with representatives of the ESO board, staff and members coming together to review ESO's achievement in 2022 and plans for 2023. During the meeting, HH Sayyida Tania Al Said, one of ESO's founding members and ESO's President since 2004 announced her intent to step down and welcomed ESO's new President, Dr Amor Al Matani. B PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Capacity Building for Cetacean Research and Conservation in Oman

There are over 80 species of cetaceans in the world, 20 of them live in Oman's water, including 4 species of great whales. ESO has been engaged in whale and dolphin research in Oman since the organization's inception in 2004, with a particular focus on the Arabian Sea humpback whale (ASHW).

Dedicated research on ASHWs has confirmed that this unique sub-population is small (possibly fewer than 100 individuals), resident in the Arabian Sea year-round, and genetically distinct and isolated from other humpback whale populations. In 2008 the population was designated as Endangered on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species. The conservation of this unique population across its regional range is critical to its survival.

Over the years, work supported by ESO has included fieldwork

and research on themes related to taxonomy, genetics, status assessments, acoustics, spatial ecology and stranding. Recognizing the need to secure the long-term sustainability of this work, ESO, with funding from HSBC Oman, has developed a training programme designed to increase the local capacity for cetacean research and conservation.

A one-year cetacean capacity building programme was launched in September 2022 with candidates from ESO as well as government agencies and other local organizations supporting cetacean conservation in Oman. Through a mixture of class room based and field-based training, the programme provides candidates with opportunities to explore their interest in various disciplines, and learn about cetacean biology, ecology,

research methodology and protocols, photo-identification, data collection, and communication. The immediate goal is to form an Omani team that can contribute to future cetacean research activities in Oman. In the longer term however, the course will also provide opportunities for candidates to progress further in science or science communication.


To date, the candidates have received four classroom-based training sessions and participated in two field surveys putting their training into practice. Over the months ahead they will be out on the water for 1-2 days a month all building to our November surveys where we hope each of the candidates will be ready to make a valuable contribution to the research necessary to help conserve Oman's Arabian Sea humpback whales.
